



Verb Worksheets

Introduction:

When teaching a child what verbs or action words are called, we start by having them simply label a picture of someone doing that action. The pictures in this pack will help the child practice verbs by describing what people are doing in pictures.

Instructions:

Choose a sheet of verbs and ask the child what each person in the picture is doing. At first, just have the child say the name of the verb, like "sit" or "sitting". Once the child knows all of the verbs in this pack, you can move on to having the child describe the pictures using full sentences, like "she is running" or "he is clapping".




