



Using Articles "a" and "the" Sentence Builder Worksheet

Introduction:

Children with language delays often have difficulty using the articles "a" and "the" in front of nouns. They may leave them off when speaking in sentences. This worksheet will help the child practice adding an article before a noun when speaking in sentences.

Instructions:

- 1. Place your finger on the first word in the sentence and say it out loud. Do the same for all words in the sentence. When you get to the blank, place your finger on the first object on the page and say the name of that object.
- 2. Now, have the child do the same thing. Help him point to each word as he says it and then pick whatever object on the page he wants.
- 3. Keep practicing this until the child can correctly say the sentences each time.
- 4. Once the child can do this, have him make up his own sentences using "a" or "the". For example, he could walk around the house and say "I see a ___" or "where's the ____".

The Next Step:

Once the child can use "a" and "the" correctly in simple sentences, you can start gently correcting the child when he leaves out articles in conversational speech. Simply model back to him the appropriate sentence. For example, if he says "I see cat", say "You can say 'I see THE cat" or "Yes, you see THE cat".

Using Articles-"A"


Help your child read the sentences below by saying each word and then choosing a noun to place at the end. Focus on the article "a".



















Using Articles-"The"

















