

## Vowel Flashcards

### What's Included:

One flashcard for each of the American English vowels. Below each vowel sound are two examples of words that feature that vowel.

### How to Use Them:

These flashcards can be used to help children who struggle with producing vowel sounds correctly. Start by having the child practice individual vowels in isolation (example: saying "ay" by itself). Practice them by showing the child the vowel and looking at the pictures below.

Once the child can say the sound in isolation, you can start working on having the child say words that contain that vowel sound. Start with short words and build your way up to more complex words.

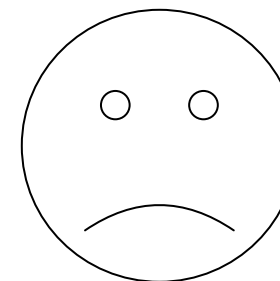

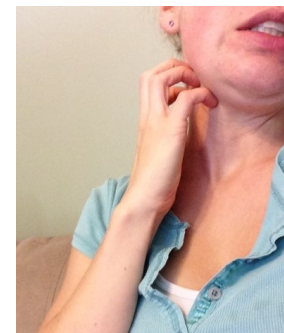

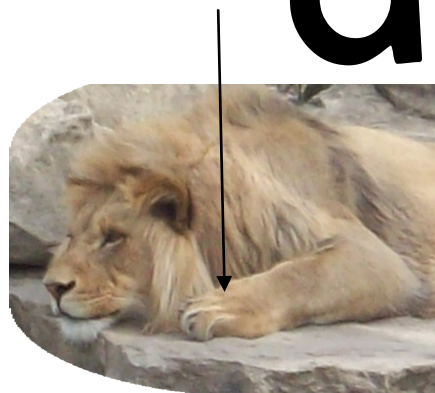
