



What's the Function?

Introduction:

One important skill in the development of vocabulary is understanding what objects do. This worksheet will help a child learn the function of basic school objects.

Instructions:

Point to one of the pictures in the top two rows on the worksheet. Ask the child to tell you what that object is. Once he can do this, ask him what it does. If he doesn't know, tell him to look at the choices below. Give him just a few choices and ask him which one is correct. Once he figures it out, have him trace his finger between the object and its function.
