

/or/ Reading Paragraph

Introduction:

When children are learning to say a new sound correctly, we first practice the sound in single word and then in sentences. After that, it can be helpful to have the child practice saying that sound correctly while reading a paragraph.

The paragraph below will help the child practice the /or/ sound when reading.

Instructions:

Have the child read the paragraph below while thinking about her good /or/ sounds. If the child misses one, have the child go back and practice just that word by itself and then say the sentence again.

Paragraph:

George and Georgia went out on a stormy day. They lived in Oregon in an orange house with a green door. It was the fourth of August and they were bored so they decided to go out for some pork, corn, and an apple core. George and Georgia and their dog Orville walked out the door onto their porch and forced open their umbrellas. George's umbrella handle looked like a sword. Georgia's umbrella was so long that it covered her entire torso and had a picture of a horse on it. They set a course for the store and went to buy their pork and corn. By the time they arrived, the storm had lifted and the weather was quite normal for the fourth of August.



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
